## WHAT WE DO

As members of the San Diego-Imperial Area Assembly's Accessibilities Committee, we administer the Sign Language Fund. We help AA groups carry the message to the Deaf alcoholic who still suffers. We do this by hiring professional sign language interpreters for AA meetings and events and paying those interpreters for their service. We make sure that the interpreters are skilled, familiar with AA, and committed to anonymity.

## **OUR GOAL**

We are working towards having 90 meetings in 90 days available for deaf and hard of hearing alcoholics.

## **HOW WE DO IT**

The Sign Language Fund pays for interpreters by accepting contributions from AA groups, districts and individual AA members. Contributions are not used for any other purpose. In keeping with the traditions we have no other affiliation and accept no outside contributions. We rely on contributions from AA members and entities to pay for interpreting services. Most groups pass the Sign Language Fund's "Gold Can."

Groups and districts are welcome to make regular contributions by group conscience. We appreciate regular contributions as they help us maintain a stable budget.
