Every time something happens, I get reminded why I do what I do. I am more than grateful for being given this great opportunity to be and the capability to help others. Please keep this family and brothers in service in prayer.

Throughout the US, things are heating up. I was advised that the Unity and Service Conference will not be happening this year. It is planned for next year in Concord. The desk assignments have changed at GSO, <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>. If you reach out and are not getting a response, please let me know. I could possibly help.
